



State Department: U.S. Involvement in the American Club in Greece: Nsiad-88-207

Dimensions: 9.7in. x 7.4in. x 0.1in.Pursuant to a congressional request, GAO reviewed the Department of States involvement with the defunct American Club in Greece. GAO found that: (1) the U. S. Embassy in Athens, Greece, established the club as an employee association in 1948; (2) the club closed in 1985, leaving unpaid debts, including employee severance payments, social security payments, bank loans, and utility bills; (3) embassy staff did not comply with regulations regarding monitoring the clubs activities; (4) a former embassy employee improperly personally cosigned a club loan; (5) the Embassy implied to Greek authorities that the cosigner had diplomatic immunity, although State regulations did not allow such immunity for employees personal debts; and (6) Greek courts held the U. S. government responsible for the clubs debts. GAO also found that: (1) State and the Department of Justice believe that the U. S. government will ultimately pay the clubs debts, but the agencies disagree over the source of funding to settle the claims; and (2) State instituted procedures to reduce the governments potential liability for similar debts, including issuing a statement regarding support for private...
