In Table 1 the 1930 statistics are given, showing the acreage planted to cotton, acre yields and amounts of fertilizers used in growing cotton in all the Southern States. Fertilizers have long been recognized as an especially important factor in cotton production in the Southeastern States. In this belt the amount of cotton land fertilized ranged in different States from to 97 per cent of the acreage in cotton in 1930. The average quantity used per acre varied from 262 pounds in Alabama to 425 pounds in North Carolina. The average acre yield of lint cotton in the several States of the southeastern group ranged from 188 pounds in Alabama to 233 pounds in North Carolina.
