The names Babylonia and Mesopotamia are both used in this book to address the geographical area between and surrounding the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers, this area corresponds to modern Iraq, Syria, and eastern Turkey. In order to accurately present certain ideas, some algebraic formulas are presented where appropriate (a short algebra refresher is contained in the appendix), however, the material should be of general interest even if the mathematics is bypassed. Also, since math and science were developed over the centuries, the information is provided within the context of an historical timeline.
