The driblet cone on the north bench was hissing and a filagree cone glowed on the edge of the north rampart. The wall around the northwest arm appeared five feet high, and the shore bombardment there and at the north and southeast coves was flinging lava over the bank so as to build it up. Flaring chimneys appeared on the north and south sides of the west arm. There was a spurting cone west of the northwest pond. South of the east promontory a large block of...
