Clinging to an ideal of benevolent imperialism untainted by commerce, while sympathizing deeply with the natives desire for cultural commerce, Clifford produced a number of collections, including Bush-Whacking and other Sketches (1901); A Free-lance of To-day (1903), Sally: A Study, and Other Tales of the Outskirts (1904), Saleh: A Sequel (1908) and Malayan Monochromes (1913), all of which deal with the interplay between British and Malay life. The Cryptofiction Classics series contains a collection of wonderful stories from some of the greatest authors in the genre, including Ambrose Bierce, Arthur Conan Doyle, Robert Louis Stevenson, and Jack London.
