Camshaft and rocker arm assemblies.--Sixty hrs. of operation in engine No. 801 did not bring to light any appreciable wear in any of these parts nor any abrasions of the bearings. On final inspection after the complete run all cams, rocker arm bearings and rollers were still found to be in excellent condition. The roller bushings in three cases were turning on the pins, which, owing to the softness of the latter, caused considerable wear. The worst of these in cylinder No. 6 is illustrated in Fig. 12. The trouble, seemed to be caused entirely by improper fitting of the roller bushings between the forked ends of the rocker arms. No trouble could be found in these parts in engine No. 719 after 75 hrs., although one rocker arm housing indicated...
