

(a), a large and increasing amount of litigation relating to trade marks, shewing the value which is set by the world of commerce upon the use of these symbols. It may safely be asserted, that many cases of infringement would never have occurred at all, and many others not have been brought into Court, had there been any ready means of ascertaining the true proprietors of the various trade marks in use in the different branches of trade. To provide these means appears to be the chief object of the short Registration Act, passed on the 15th of July, 1875, and the numerous rules thereunder published in January, 1876.
