The hills of Ingleborough and Penyngant are visible from Morecambe Bay. Between the Bibble and the Mersey extends the Lancashire coalfield, corresponding in latitude with the Yorkshire coalfield on the other side of the Pennines. Skirting the coast and the edge of the coalfield is the red sandstone plain, which opens out in the plain of Cheshire, probably concealing a coalfield below. The Weaver drains this plain, which is famous for its salt deposits. The up-raised Staffordshire moorlands cut it off from the contiguous basin of the Trent. The flat coastlands of Lancashire on either side of the Bibble are covered with alluvium. The Lancashire coalfield is interrupted by the uplifting of the underlying millstone grit, with the result that two groups of industrial towns have arisen--one to the north towards the Bibble, the other to the south, towards the Mersey.
