

NUX VOMICA, Strychnos Nux Vomica, Vomit Nut, --Loganiaceae, --East Indies. Specific symptomatology: broad, pallid tongue. Physiological action: Nux vomica and its active principle, Strychnine, act on the spinal cord and the medulla; the full medicinal dose causes an increase of reflex activity, of respiratory rate, pulse force, arterial pressure, and a general systemic excitement with unusual acuity of hearing and vision. Nux is stimulant, while Strychnine is sharply shocking. Nux causes general excitement, excites the motor tract of the cord, and increases receptive activity of the sensory tract; it is a direct stimulant to the heart muscle, also a powerful excitant to the respiratory center; it especially stimulates the Pneumogastric nerve. While it has no direct effect on the bodily temperature, it will warm up in conditions of coldness and clamminess of the skin. A single large dose will cause a violent convulsion, while when the poisoning is slow, and the onset gradual, convulsive movements of tetanic character will result; the body is rigid and rounded out into opisthotonos, the stiffening starting at the back of the neck; the convulsions twist the body and the movements are uneven. Elimination of the agent takes place through the kidneys, and in the liver the remedy is oxidised and destroyed. Antidote: Amyl Nitrite after evacuating the stomach; chemical antidote: Potassium Bromide and Chloral, hypodermically and per rectum. Administration:...
