The Turks dye their beards a very fine rich brown or black by means of a metal found in the East, said to be iron pyrites, but that is doubtful. I think it is an alloy of iron and copper in a state of oxide. They use for a mordant roasted Aleppo galls with some henna, and mixed with starch. In dying the beard they first mix up the gall powder into a paste with water, and thoroughly rub it into the beard, letting it dry, and if wanted jet black it is necessary to repeat this application, taking care not to get it on the skin. After the lapse of some hours the metal dye is treated in the same way, and gently rubbed into the beard, when a fine color is produced, according to the quantity used or the...



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
