From this point the river flows in a south easterly direction and empties into Lake Ontario at the village of Port Credit, seven miles west of the city of Toronto. In its upper reaches, at Credit Forks and Cataract, it cuts through the cuesta and exposes the Cataract and Lockport divisions of the Silurian, and the Queenston red shales. Between Credit Forks and Meadowvale, it winds slowly over the at-lying drift which covers the Queenston shales. Two miles south of Meadowvale, the grey fossiliferous beds of the Richmond are first exposed, and from here to its mouth, a distance of about eight miles, the river cuts through these rocks in many places and in addition, exposes the upper part of the underlying formation herein called Dundas.
