

DIABETES INSIPIDUS. We use the term glycosuria or melituria to describe a more or less temporary condition, in which sugar appears in the urine under varied circumstances. If the amount of sugar is slight and it soon disappears, the condition may be merely glycosuria. It is noticed (i) in healthy persons after excessive indulgence in sugar; 200 gm. (seven ounces) or upwards at one time of grape sugar, in solution, may cause the appearance in an horr or two of a small amount of dextrose in the urine (alimentary glycosuria). If sugar appear in the urine after taking small amounts, as 50 to 100 gm. (two to three ounces) the condition is called morbid alimentary glycosuria.
