This book is a brief view of what has come to be over a period of 13.7 billion years; one not simply, collectively, and consequentially previously told. In the language of yesteryear, it takes us from bang to man; or in that of today, from forces to females. It briefly summarises the evidence that answers the child's question how did people get here. But more importantly, on the basis of this, and other, evidence, it then strives to answer their further question why do people do that. The answers challenge adults...
