

The force of this is apparent when we bear in mind that rainfall, less evaporation, as we have considered it, gives the amount of water which will flow off in the streams. Mr. George S. Rafter, C. E., in a valuable article on stream flow in relation to forests takes exception to the theory advanced by Mr. Vermeule, on the ground that the New Jersey data, on which he chiefly bases his statement, are too restricted in their scope to give any concluclusionon the point in question, and also calls attention to some errors in refutation of Mr. Vermeule s theory by instancing the run-off of the Upper Hudson river, stating that In 1892 the total rainfall was 53.87, the run-off 33.08, and the evaporation 20.79 inches. A comparison of the two years, 1891-92, as regards the evaporation, is exceedingly interesting. The rainfall in 1892 was 10.91 inches more while the evaporation was only 0.39 greater than in 1891. As illustrating this position further, we may take the year 1893, when the total rainfall dropped to 42.18 inches, or within 0.78 inches of what it was in 1891, whereupon the evaporation showed 20.27 inches, or practically the same figure as in 1891.
