All the passes across the Sufed Koh were closed during the month. February. --Very light falls occurred on the Sufed Koh and neighbouring hills on the ghanduth. At the close of the month snow lay to a depth of about 7 feet on the higher peaks of the Sufed Koh. The total fall of the season up to the end of February was greater in amount than in the corresponding periods of the previous three years. (4) Koiat District (tirah). g. January. --During the month there were in all eleven falls of snow on the hills on the border. The heaviest fall occurred on the 23rd. At Fort Lockart the severest storm occurred on the 22nd when 2 feet of snow fell. February. --No snow fell during the month. March. --No snow fell on the Samilzai hills. There were...



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
