P. 23, July 1902) writes regarding the Alexander Operation, or the Alexander Adams Operation for retro-displacements. He is very positive regarding the efficacy Of this means of treatment in properly selected cases, but he is also more conservative in its application than he was formerly. The uterus should be freely movable; if there are adhesions it is not a suitable case, even if the posterior fornix be opened and the adhesions broken up. A person with some constitutional dyscrasia is not a fit subject. It is very doubtful whether this shortening of the round ligaments is of much use in mere prolapsus uteri, or in cases where the uterus is very heavy or weighed down by a fibroid. Where shortening of the round ligaments is not indicated, Cleveland believes in Bissell s operation of internal shortening of the round and broad ligaments: it consists in cutting out a section of each round ligament,...
