This book presents a well-balanced historical background of the civil rights era even while serving as a tribute to Maxine Smith and her work. A panoramic view of Maxine s life, Maxine Smith s Unwilling Pupils, presents one woman s struggle as a prism for understanding the human dimensions of the fight for equality. The biography portrays Smith s lifelong focus on education as she tried to enlighten both blacks and whites about equality and the inalienable rights of all races. Along the way she became the face of the civil rights movement in Memphis during a critical time in the movement s history. Maxine s unwilling pupils often hated her...
