A company of emigrants sailed for Naumkeag in 1628, and as a provisional government was necessary, The Governor and Council of London s Plantation in the Massachusetts Bay in New England was established, and John Endecott was chosen governor. The members of the corporation remaining in England were to retain a share in the trading stock and the profits for seven years. The management was committed to five persons who were going to Massachusetts and to five who stayed at home. At the expiration of the seven years the stock and profits were to be divided to each man according to his adventure. All other powers and privileges were given to the planters. It is not known whether any division was ever made or any trade carried on for the company, - in contrast to the agreement between the London...
