Short stories often begin 'in medias res', which means that the reader is 'thrown' directly into the action of the story, without being elaborately informed about the earlier events. This effects a steady build up of tension and calls the reader's attention. In addition to that, this species of narrative writing usually contains an open ending or a surprising twist at the end. Instead of detailed descriptions, insinuations and sketchiness dominate, consequently the style of writing is to some extent laconic. The language can be considered to be unostentatious and simple, and so are most...
