Greater penetration of the rays should be expected to occur in the pines, since they possess more numerous ray tracheids, or water-conducting cells, and larger pits between the rayparenchyma and the vertical water-conducting fibers, Photo 10. However, even if the rays were readily permeable to preservatives, which appears to be extremely doubtful, they would be of primary significance only in lateral penetration across the annual rings. Since each vertical water-conducting element is in communication with one or more rays, and inasmuch as there is no valve-like action in the pits between the fibers and the ray parenchyma, the rays might well be an important channel for penetrating fibers whose bordered pits are sealed or closed by the valve-like action of the tori. 1 lower, in all probability the rays play on the whole...
