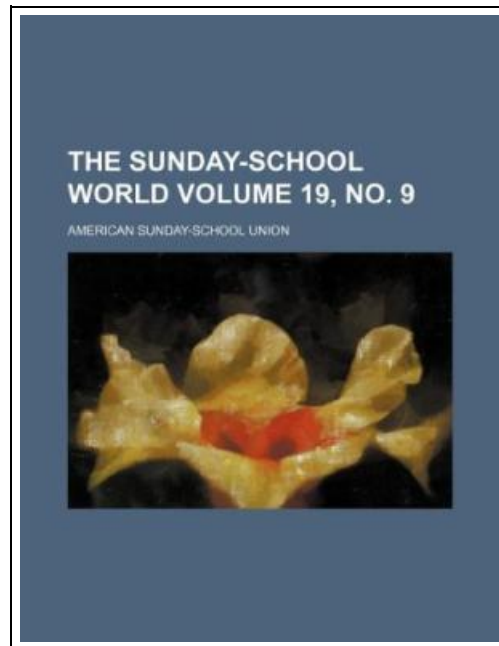

Saul came to the caves used as sheepcotes, and entered one of them alone, not knowing that David and his men were in the deeper recesses of the same cave beyond him (v. 3). W. M. Thomson tells how it is impossible for one just entering such a cave to see beyond him into the darker depths of the cave, even for a few feet, while those some time within the recesses could see clearly every movement of a new-comer. Thus David s band, seeing Saul within their power, urged him to accept it as providential, and to slay his enemy. David was partly persuaded; silently he stepped forward, and without Saul s knowledge cut off a part (literally, a wing) of the skirt of the royal cloak (v. 4).
