Professor Hardy first came before the general reading public in 1883, by the publication of But Yet a Woman. Before that time he was known only to a restricted number of scholars by his mathematical publications. As professor of mathematics he had issued several works. He first published in 1881 the Elements of Quaternions, which at once gave him a high reputation as a mathematical scholar. This was followed by an annotated translation of Argand s Theory of Imaginary Quantities, and a contribution to a work on the Application of Photography to Surveying, both belonging to Van Nostrand s Scientific Series. But, while Professor Hardy was a worker in the field of mathematics, he always had a taste for literary subjects and literary work. Mathematical power implies a vigorous imagination, and it is not strange that he should have turned from the consideration of the nth power of numbers to a field that most would regard as more attractive, and took up fiction as his by-work. The publication of But Yet a Woman was a surprise...
